#### Important Information for Vestries/Bishop's Committees:

Those seekers who have completed a discernment process including a clearness committee and a regional discernment committee may be commended to the vestry/bishop's committee for nomination. The vestry should interview the person and evaluate the potential nominee according to six criteria: Integrity, Self-discipline, Commitment, Maturity, Focus on the other, Articulation, Prudence, Leadership, and Intelligence. Nomination sets a high standard for vestries: the person so endorsed must be someone the vestry/bishop's committee has confidence in, will continue to engage as formation evolves, and will support spiritually and financially.

The vestry/bishop's committee is required to send in a certificate of support at each stage of the process – for nomination as a postulant, as a candidate, for ordination to the diaconate, and for ordination to the priesthood. The enrollment fee for nomination is \$1,500 and it will be shared: \$500 from the vestry/bishop's committee, \$500 from the candidate, and \$500 from the diocese. This fee pays for the required psychological/vocational testing, which is extensive, and for the Oxford document background check.

For Postulants for the Vocational Diaconate, enrollment in the Province I School for Vestries is required. Tuition is \$2,000 for two years. Vestries/bishop's committees and postulants are each asked to contribute \$650 per year, each of the two years. The diocese underwrites the final one third for each year. All payments should be sent to the Episcopal Diocese of New Hampshire. Fees can be waived if the postulant or the church can demonstrate need.
